# Safe Digging and Damage Prevention

## Understanding the Prescribed Area

The Prescribed Area is the strip of land extending 30 metres (100 feet) in both directions from the centreline of pipe(s). The purpose of the Prescribed Area is to ensure the protection of pipelines from damage that may result from ground disturbance activities or operation of heavy equipment. In the Prescribed Area, you must take extra precautions and get written consent from Kingston Midstream before you can do certain activities.

## Understanding the Right of Way

A Right of Way is a strip of land of varying widths that may contain one or more pipelines. The Right of Way allows Kingston Midstream's workers access to the pipes for inspection, maintenance, testing or emergencies.

Permanent pipeline markers are located at roads, railways, and other intervals along the Right of Way, to show the approximate location of the pipelines. The depth and location of the pipelines vary within the Right of Way.

Do not assume that the pipeline is in the middle of the Right of Way



If you are planning to excavate or use equipment within the Prescribed Area you must contact Kingston Midstream first to obtain written consent. We will work with you so that you may complete your work safely.

To protect public safety and to reduce pipeline damage, you must contact us directly or through the 1<sup>st</sup> Call or Click Before You Dig systems at least three working days before beginning any work within the prescribed area.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Call or Click Before You Dig

We know that sometimes work needs to be done on or near the right of way. Request a locate through 1<sup>st</sup> Call or Click Before You Dig, a free pipeline location service. Within three working days of your request, a Kingston Midstream representative will be in contact with you, ready to mark the exact location of the line.

Utilize 1<sup>st</sup> Call or Click Before You Dig within 30 metres (100 feet) on each side of the centreline of pipe(s) or if unsure of pipe location.

# 5-STEP SAFETY CHECKLIST

If you are planning on conducting work on or near a Kingston Midstream Right of Way please follow this 5-step safety checklist:



**1**  
Plan your activity - identify the precise location of your work, check records for evidence of other buried utilities. Obtain written consent, if required

**2**  
Contact your local one-call centre

**3**  
Plan to be on-site when the pipeline is being located and ensure all other buried utilities are located

**4**  
Immediately notify Kingston Midstream at **1-888-420-4357** if you come into contact with a pipe or its coating

**5**  
Always follow the instructions of a Kingston Midstream representative

## We'll Be There

We will help you avoid problems and delays by:



Locating and marking our pipelines within three business days.



Issuing written consents for excavation or equipment use within the Prescribed Area or Right of Way, within 10 business days.



Ensuring a Kingston Midstream field representative visits the site.

**NOTE:** Planning and consent may take longer in some locations.

## Other Activities within the Prescribed Area

If you plan to carry out certain activities within the Prescribed Area, you must first consult with Kingston Midstream. This includes contacting us in advance when:

- Driving heavy equipment across the pipeline outside of normal agricultural use
- Installing/repairing/replacing fence posts
- Removing trees or brush
- Installing/repairing/replacing underground utilities, pipelines, and cables
- Conducting any surface work with equipment
- Trenching or any sort of groundwork for water movement
- Deep tilling or cultivation greater than 45cm
- Constructing or paving roads, driveways, parking, ditches
- Constructing above ground structures (ex: shed, barn etc.)
- Constructing berms or installing pilings
- Stockpiling of any type of materials
- Removing or adding soil cover
- Using explosives

## Operations That Do Not Require Consent

Kingston Midstream does not require notification or consultation for the operation of agricultural equipment and vehicles across the pipeline **if the following conditions are met:**

- Cultivation is to a depth less than 45cm
- The loaded axle weight and tire pressures of the vehicle or agricultural equipment are within the manufacturer's approved limits and operating guidelines
- You have not received notification from Kingston Midstream that crossing or use of agricultural equipment at that location could impair the pipeline's safety or security
